



ANIMAL REGISTRATIONS



In 2008 the State Government introduced the Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008. Section 44 and 45 of this Act required that animal owners to register their dog and cat within their Local Government Authority.

All dogs and cats that are kept within the Weipa Township and are ages three months or over must be registered with the Weipa Town Authority (WTA) each year. Registrations expire each year on June 30 and must be renewed by 1 July.

Microchipping

All dogs and cats born after 10 April 2009 must be microchipped and or before they are sold or given away.

Benefits of Registration

It allows for quick and easy identification of your dog should it be wandering at large. This allows the WTA to return your dog to you as soon as possible.

Note: it is currently a requirement to register your cat, however the WTA does not charge for the registration of cats. Cats are FREE to register.

Dog Registration Fees

Registration fees vary according to the status of the dog and any concession that may apply to the owner. These fees are set each year by the WTA.

The WTA offers:

- Discounts for desexed (deseed) dogs.
- Free registrations for puppies up to 12 months of age.
- Pro-rata registration.
- Reciprocal registration (free transfer from other councils).
- Discount for pensioners.

What you get for your registration fees?

The WTA provides an animal management service to the Weipa community. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Responding to calls of wandering dogs and dog attack to ensure community safety is upheld.
- Dealing with community complaints relating to animals.
- The control of 'dangerous', 'menacing' and 'restricted breed' dogs to ensure they do not pose a risk to the community.

Limit of dogs on premises

There is a limit to the number of dogs that can be kept on a property.

- One dog in a unit.
- Two dog's in a house

If you would like to house more than this allocated number of dogs, you must apply for an additional dog permit with WTA.

How to register your animal

You must submit a completed registration form along with the allocated fee to the WTA. This can be done face to face, by visiting the Town Office. You can download a registration form online at www.weipatownauthority.com.au. Once you pay your new registration fees you will receive a dog or cat tag that must be displayed on your dog or cat's collar at all times.

When to notify WTA

You must notify the WTA as soon as possible if any of the following changes occur:

- Your personal details change i.e. address or contact number or email address.
- The dog or cat has moved to another premises or has a new owner.
- The dog or cat dies or is missing.
- Ownership of the dog or cat is transferred to another person.
